

(Mat 4:4) But He answered and said, It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God."

(Luk 1:38) And Mary said, Behold the servant of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word. And the angel departed from her.

(Rom 10:17) Then faith is of hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. And take up the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God.

(Eph 6:17) And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God,

(Gen 20:17) And Abraham prayed to God, and God healed Abimelech and his wife and his slave women, and they gave birth.

(Exo 15:26) And he said, If you will carefully listen to the voice of Jehovah your God, and will do that which is right in His sight, and will give ear to His commandments, and keep all His Laws, I will put none of these diseases upon you, which I have brought upon the Egyptians; for I am Jehovah who heals you.

(2Ki 2:21) And he went forth to the spring of the waters and threw the salt in there, and said, So says Jehovah, I have healed these waters. There shall not be any more death or barrenness from there.

(2Ki 2:22) And the waters were healed to this day, according to the saying of Elisha which he spoke.

(2Ki 8:29) And King Jehoram went back to be healed in Jezreel from the wounds which the Syrians had given him in Ramah, when he fought against Hazael king of Syria. And Ahaziah the son of Jehoram king of Judah went down to see Jehoram the son of Ahab in Jezreel, because he was sick.

(2Ki 20:5) Return again and tell Hezekiah the leader of My people, So says Jehovah, the God of David your father, I have heard your prayer, I have seen your tears. Behold, I will heal you. On the third day you shall go up to the house of Jehovah.

(2Ch 7:14) if My people, who are called by My name, shall humble themselves and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from Heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

(2Ch 30:20) And Jehovah listened to Hezekiah and healed the people.

(Psa 6:2) Have mercy on me, O Jehovah, for I am weak; O Jehovah, heal me, for my bones are troubled.

(Psa 30:2) O Jehovah my God, I cried to You, and You have healed me.

(Psa 41:4) I said, Jehovah, be merciful to me; heal my soul; for I have sinned against You.

(Psa 60:2) You made the earth tremble; You tore it; heal the breaks of it, for it is shaking.

(Psa 103:1) A Psalm of David. Bless Jehovah, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name.

(Psa 103:2) Bless Jehovah, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits;

(Psa 103:3) who forgives all your iniquities; who heals all your diseases;

(Psa 103:4) who redeems your life from ruin; who crowns you with loving-kindness and tender mercies;

(Psa 103:5) who satisfies your mouth with good; your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

(Psa 107:20) He sent His Word and heals them, and delivers them from their pitfalls.

(Psa 147:3) He heals the broken-hearted, and binds up their wounds.

(Pro 4:20) My son, listen to my words; bow down your ear to my sayings.

(Pro 4:21) Let them not depart from your eyes; keep them in the midst of your heart.

(Pro 4:22) For they are life to those who find them, and health to all his flesh.

(Pro 12:18) There are those who speak like the thrusts of a sword, but the tongue of the wise heals.

(Pro 13:17) A wicked messenger falls into mischief, but a faithful ambassador is health.

(Pro 16:24) Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones.

(Isa 53:4) Surely He has borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

(Isa 53:5) But He was wounded for our transgressions; He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was on Him; and with His stripes we ourselves are healed.

(Jer 3:22) Return, O backsliding sons, and I will heal your backslidings. Behold, we come to You; for You are Jehovah our God.

(Jer 17:14) Heal me, O Jehovah, and I shall be healed, save me, and I shall be saved; for You are my praise.

(Mat 4:23) And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.

(Mat 4:24) And His fame went throughout all Syria. And they brought to Him all those being badly ill suffering various diseases and torments, and those who had been possessed with demons, and those who had been moonstruck, and paralytics. And He healed them.

(Mat 8:7) And Jesus says to him, I will come and heal him.

(Mat 8:8) The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof; but only speak the word, and my boy will be healed.

(Mat 8:13) And Jesus said to the centurion, Go. And as you have believed, so let it be to you. And his boy was healed in that hour.

(Mat 8:16) And evening coming on, they brought to Him many who had been possessed with demons. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick

(Mat 9:35) And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people.

(Mat 10:1) And when He had called to Him His twelve disciples, He gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease.

(Mat 10:8) Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. You have received freely, freely give.

(Mat 12:15) But when Jesus knew it, He withdrew Himself from there. And great crowds followed Him, and He healed them all.

(Mat 12:22) Then one who had been demon-possessed was brought to Him, blind and dumb. And He healed him, so much so that the blind and dumb one both spoke and saw.

(Mat 14:14) And Jesus went out and saw a great crowd, and He was moved with compassion toward them. And He healed their sick.

(Mat 15:28) Then Jesus answered and said to her, O woman, great is your faith! So be it to you even as you wish. And her daughter was healed from that very hour.

(Mat 15:30) And great crowds came to Him, having with them the lame, blind, dumb, maimed, and many others. And they cast them down at Jesus' feet. And He healed them,

(Mat 19:2) And great crowds followed Him. And He healed them there.

(Mat 21:14) And the blind and the lame came to Him in the temple, and He healed them.

(Mar 1:34) And He healed many who were sick of different diseases, and cast out many demons. And He did not allow the demons to speak, because they knew Him.

(Mar 3:10) For He had healed many, so that they pressed on Him in order to touch Him, as many as had plagues.

(Mar 3:14) And He ordained twelve, that they should be with Him, and that He might send them out to proclaim,

(Mar 3:15) and to have authority to heal sicknesses, and to cast out demons.

(Mar 5:22) And, behold, one of the synagogue rulers came, Jairus by name. And when he saw Him, he fell at His feet.

(Mar 5:23) And he begged Him greatly, saying, My little daughter lies at the point of death. Come, lay Your hands on her, so that she may be healed, and she shall live.

(Mar 5:24) And Jesus went with him. And many people followed Him and thronged Him.

(Mar 5:25) And a certain woman who had had an issue of blood twelve years,

(Mar 5:26) and had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and had not been bettered any, but rather came to worse,

(Mar 5:27) having heard about Jesus, she came in the press behind and touched His garment.

(Mar 5:28) For she said, If I may but touch only His clothes, I will be cured.

(Mar 5:29) And instantly the fountain of her blood dried up. And she felt in her body that she was healed of that plague.

(Mar 5:30) And knowing instantly within Himself that power had gone out of Him, Jesus turned Himself around in the press and said, Who touched My clothes?

(Mar 5:31) And His disciples said to Him, You see the crowd pressing on You, and do You say, Who touched Me?

(Mar 5:32) And He looked around to see her who had done this thing.

(Mar 5:33) But the woman, fearing and trembling, knowing what had been done in her, came and fell down before Him and told Him all the truth.

(Mar 5:34) And He said to her, Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace, and be whole from your plague.

(Mar 5:35) While He still spoke, they came from the synagogue ruler's house, saying, Your daughter is dead; why do you still trouble the Teacher?

(Mar 5:36) But hearing the word spoken, Jesus said to the synagogue ruler, Do not be afraid, only believe.

(Mar 5:37) And He allowed no one to follow Him, except Peter and James and John, the brother of James.

(Mar 5:38) And He came to the synagogue ruler's and saw a tumult, and weeping and much wailing.

(Mar 5:39) And going in He said to them, Why do you make a tumult and weep? The girl is not dead, but sleeps.

(Mar 5:40) And they laughed at Him. But when He had put them all out, He took the father and the mother of the child, and those with Him, and went in where the child was lying.

(Mar 5:41) And He took the child's hand and said to her, Talitha koumi; (which interpreted is, Little girl, I say to you, Arise!)

(Mar 5:42) And instantly the little girl arose and walked (for she was twelve years old). And they were astonished with a great astonishment.

(Mar 6:13) And they cast out many demons, and anointed many who were sick with oil, and healed them.

(Mar 10:52) And Jesus said to him, Go, your faith has healed you. And instantly he saw again, and he followed Jesus in the way.

(Luk 4:18) "The Spirit of the Lord is on Me; because of this He has anointed Me to proclaim the Gospel to the poor. He has sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim deliverance to the captives, and new sight to the blind, to set at liberty those having been crushed,

(Luk 4:40) And the sun sinking, all, as many as had sick ones with different kinds of diseases brought them to Him. And laying hands on each of them, He healed them.

(Luk 5:15) But the word about Him spread even more. And great crowds were coming to hear, and to be healed from their infirmities by Him.

(Luk 6:17) And coming down with them, He stood on a level place. And a crowd of His disciples, and a great multitude of people from all Judea and Jerusalem, and the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon (who came to hear Him and to be healed of their diseases) were there;

(Luk 6:18) also those tormented by unclean spirits; and they were healed.

(Luk 6:19) And all the crowd sought to touch Him, for power went out of Him and healed them all.

(Luk 7:3) And when he heard of Jesus, he sent the elders of the Jews to Him, begging Him that He would come and heal his servant.

(Luk 7:4) And coming to Jesus, they begged Him earnestly, saying that he was worthy, he for whom You give this;

(Luk 7:5) for, they said, He loves our nation, and he has built us a synagogue.

(Luk 7:6) Then Jesus went with them. But He being yet not far off from the house, the centurion sent friends to Him, saying to Him, Lord, do not trouble Yourself. For I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof.

(Luk 7:7) Therefore neither did I think myself worthy to come to You; but say a word, and my servant will be healed.

(Luk 7:8) For I also am a man set under authority, having under me soldiers. And I say to one, Go, and he goes; and to another, Come, and he comes; and to my servant, Do this, and he does it.

(Luk 7:9) And hearing these things, Jesus marveled at him. And turning to the crowd following Him, He said, I say to you, I have not found such faith, no, not in Israel.

(Luk 7:10) And they who were sent, returning to the house, found the sick servant well.

(Luk 8:36) Also those who saw it told them how the demon-possessed one was healed.

(Luk 8:43) And a woman who had a flow of blood twelve years (who had spent all her living on physicians, and could not be healed by any)

(Luk 8:47) And seeing that she was not hidden, the woman came trembling. And falling down before Him, she declared to Him before all the people why she had touched Him, and how she was instantly healed.

(Luk 8:50) But when Jesus heard, He answered Him, saying, Do not fear, only believe and she shall be healed.

(Luk 9:2) And He sent them to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick.

(Luk 9:6) And they departed and went through the towns, proclaiming the gospel and healing everywhere.

(Luk 9:11) But knowing this, the crowds followed Him. And He received them and spoke to them of the kingdom of God, and He healed those who had need of healing.

(Luk 9:38) And behold, a man cried aloud from the crowd, saying, Teacher, I beseech You, look on my son, for he is my only-born son.

(Luk 9:39) And lo, a spirit takes him, and he suddenly cries out. And it throws him into convulsions, with foaming, and with pain departs from him, bruising him.

(Luk 9:40) And I begged Your disciples to cast him out, and they could not.

(Luk 9:41) And answering, Jesus said, O unbelieving generation, one having been perverted, how long shall I be with you and endure you? Bring your son here.

(Luk 9:42) And as he was still coming, the demon violently convulsed and tore him. And Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit and healed the child and delivered him again to his father.

(Luk 10:9) And heal the sick that are in it, and say to them, The kingdom of God has come near you!

(Luk 17:12) And as He entered into a certain village, ten leprous men met Him, who stood afar off.

(Luk 17:13) And they lifted voice and said, Jesus, Master, pity us!

(Luk 17:14) And seeing them, He said to them, Go show yourselves to the priests. And it happened, as they went, that they were cleansed.

(Luk 17:15) And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back and glorified God with a loud voice.

(Act 3:1) And on the same day Peter and John went up into the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour.

(Act 3:2) And a certain man, who was lame from his mother's womb, was being carried. And they laid him daily at that temple gate which is called Beautiful, to ask alms from those who entered into the temple.

(Act 3:3) Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked to receive alms.

(Act 3:4) And fastening his eyes on him, Peter with John said, Look on us!

(Act 3:5) And he paid heed to them, expecting to receive something from them.

(Act 3:6) But Peter said, Silver and gold have I none, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!

(Act 3:7) And taking him by the right hand, he lifted him up. And immediately his feet and ankle-bones received strength.

(Act 3:8) And leaping up, he stood and walked and entered with them into the temple, walking and leaping and praising God.

(Act 3:9) And all the people saw him walking and praising God.

(Act 5:15) So as to carry out the sick into the streets and place them on cots and mattresses, so that at least the shadow of Peter passing by might overshadow some of them.

(Act 5:16) And also a multitude came from the cities around Jerusalem, bringing sick ones, and those being tormented by unclean spirits, who were all healed.

(Act 8:5) And Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed Christ to them.

(Act 8:6) And the people with one accord gave heed to those things which Philip spoke, hearing and seeing the many miracles which he did.

(Act 8:7) For out of those having unclean spirits, many came out, crying with loud voice. And many who had been paralyzed and lame were healed.

(Act 8:8) And there was great joy in that city.

(Act 9:33) And there he found a certain man named Aeneas, who had lain eight years on a mattress, paralyzed.

(Act 9:34) And Peter said to him, Aeneas, Jesus the Christ heals you; rise up and spread for yourself! And he arose immediately.

(Act 10:38) how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, and He went about doing good, and healing all those who were oppressed by the Devil, for God was with Him.

(Act 14:8) And a certain man was sitting in Lystra, without strength in the feet, being lame from his mother's womb, who never had walked.

(Act 14:9) This one heard Paul speaking; and Paul, looking intently at him, and seeing that he had faith to be healed,

(Act 14:10) said with a loud voice, Stand up on your feet! And he leaped and walked.

(Act 28:8) And it happened the father of Publius was lying down, suffering fevers and dysentery; to whom Paul entered in, and praying and laying on his hands, he healed him.

(1Co 12:9) and to another faith by the same Spirit; and to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit;

(1Co 12:28) And God set some in the church, firstly, apostles; secondly, prophets; thirdly, teachers, then works of power, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, kinds of languages.

(Heb 12:13) And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way, but let it rather be healed.

(Jas 5:16) Confess faults to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous one avails much.

(1Pe 2:24) He Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that dying to sins, we might live to righteousness; by whose stripes you were healed.

(3Jn 1:2) Beloved, in regard to all things I pray that you prosper and be in health, even as your soul prospers.
